

# Georgia Homeschool Reporting

## How Georgia treats homeschooling

Georgia requires a Declaration of Intent and annual progress reports retained at home.

## What to keep on file

- File the Declaration of Intent within 30 days of starting, then by September 1 each year.
- Teach the 5 required subjects: reading, language arts, math, social studies, science.
- Future Her maps as: ELA (Reading Boss + Future Speak), social studies / life skills (Media Decoder + Future Money), career ed (Future CEO Lab).
- Maintain attendance records (180 days, 4.5 hrs/day) and write an annual progress assessment.
- Standardized test every 3 years starting in 3rd grade — retain results at home (not submitted).

## Future Her artifacts that satisfy review

- Scope & Sequence PDF — syllabus / course of study.
- Standards Crosswalk PDF — alignment to ELA, SEL, and life skills.
- Printable Workbook pages — dated student work samples.
- Quarterly Progress Report — narrative + growth indicators.
- Certificates of Completion — end-of-program documentation.
